Oscar Alberto Bográn was born In Honduras, Central America and raised in NYC. With a Masters in Fine Arts From Tufts University and The School Museum of Fine Arts Boston, Mr. Bográn is a multidisciplinary artist with a focus on the social: the state of contemporary religion, American capitalism and the disparity of communities of color. A public artist and arts History professor with SUNY Schenectady, Mr. Bográn has his roots in Hip Hop Culture specifically Graffiti Art. He has developed a form of arts activism that includes iconography, installations and performance as well as traditional fine arts. Mr. Bográn has discovered the powerful influence art has had in the civil rights movement and activists throughout history. His goal and purpose is to harness the influence of change through the arts, redevelop impoverished communities throughout the world, and empower marginalized people by allowing a platform to express the needs for social change.

March Demonstration

Abstract Painting in Mixed Media with Kit Kelly Yedinak

Kit started out by showing us paintings on her website. Her introduction began with her following statement. An intuitive, creative purpose guides my artistic process and is motivated by a desire to find community engagement as well as the emotionally healing value that making art brings. My purpose is to communicate authentically, in order to share my genuine belief: Art contributes positively to a sense of personal well-being, connectedness to each other, to nature and the world. She is able to show her paintings as they would look in a home, office or

whatever setting by using an app called Smartist.app, where you can download your images and place them in a real setting. She has been an artist all her life and started doing cold wax and oil in 2021. She paints emotionally and spiritually and likes the cold wax/oil as it is fun, forgiving and lends itself to abstract, collage, figurative, any

style of painting. She studied online with Andrea Wedell and she shared some of Andrea's paintings also.

Kit works on Arches Oil paper or on wood panels. She mentioned that the same composition rules apply in abstract as well as representational work. She starts by "Activating

her canvas" with scribbles of oil pastels and markers. Then she mixes 1/2 cold wax and 1/2 oil paint, to get a very buttery mixture and she adds Galkyd Gel by Gamblin to extend the colors and make the paint dry faster. She starts putting light colors down with a palette knife, covering the surface with lots of color. She can then add texture with thicker paint and various tools and textured papers to add interest. Then you let this underlayer dry, and add layers of more solid

colors on top. When that dries, you scrape back into the painting and reveal lots of layers underneath, revealing lots of surprises.



April Workshop with Kit Kelly Yedinak ~ A Big Hit!





For those who didn't attend, you missed a very informative and enjoyable "artsperience". Kit's process of layering with cold wax and oil paints gives the artist a unique means of expression. She shared many interesting ways to "activate the substrate" - in other words -start the first layer of the painting and applying a combination of pastels, oil paint sticks and oil paints mixed with an agent to improve drying time as well as the cold wax. From there, palette knives and a variety of tools including brayer roller and scraper, as well as use of random items to press patterns into the paint, to create primarily abstract works, resulted in a variety of unique paintings by our group. **Denise Crisafulli**

April Demonstration Fabric Art with Kathy Velis Turan



Kathy Velis Turan, a mixed media fiber artist, gave a wonderful slide presentation of her work as well as sharing some actual pieces that she created. She began by saying that artists should have an "elevator speech" which is a short three sentence explanation of your work. Here is hers: "I am a mixed media fiber artist, my pieces are "snap-shots" of how humanity and nature collide...from my point of view. Drawings are made based on scenes I encounter or from my imagination. I then turn them into mixed media fiber art. I use screen printing, dyes, paints and pigment markers to surface design these images onto cloth or canvas. Finally, I use free-motion quilt and/or hand embellish to add texture, depth and addition of color






to my work." She scans the drawing and then prints it as large or small as she wants the final piece to be. She uses an "Air-pen" filled with a special drawing

solution to outline her image on to a screen. After washing, drying and ironing the textiles, she paints them with acrylic paint. A quilt is defined as 2 pieces of fabric with batting in between. After these pieces are pinned together she free-motion quilts the piece and considers the "thread as strokes" like a paint brush. She does canvas mosaics, collage, quilting on canvas that she then stretches like a regular canvas.

She likes to keep her eyes open for design - good and bad all everywhere. She likes to see art at every opportunity and takes classes to get new ideas. She

enjoys playing with many different art mediums and works to the best of her ability to create her own style.
