# Meeting Recaps

# **September Meeting Demonstration by Ken Wilson**

Eden Compton was scheduled to give a presentation on color theory, but found out this day that she had been exposed to COVID and had to cancel. She very graciously found Ken Wilson to fill in for her. Eden will now be our presenter in January.





Ken does mostly plein air painting in oil with palette knife. He works very quickly and goes from dark to light as he paints. He blocks in areas and then goes back with some detail and does his sky and clouds at the end. Ken always finishes a painting in one sitting. He has studied with many artists and has his work in numerous galleries.

Ken entertained us with stories from his past as a NY State Trooper. He is also a pilot and hopes to go up and take photos to do aerial paintings. He has always done artwork and as a kid he used to go to the Albany Institute and stand in front of paintings and study them.

# October Meeting Demonstration by Matt Chinian

Matt Chinian, from Cambridge, NY gave a very interesting oil painting demonstration. Matt normally does plein air, but did a still life tonight. He sets his palette up the same way each time with 2 yellow, 2 red, 2 blue, black and white paints. Matt uses RGH oil paints made right here in Albany at a facility on Railroad Ave.



He said it's very important to get his canvas lined up very precisely with his subject matter before he starts painting, and he likes to have his canvas eye level with his subject. For plein air painting he has his backpack, easel, canvas and palette very compact for travel.



He starts with a palette knife to lay in color on a panel that is already prepped with a base color. Then he uses round brushes, that he stores in the leg of an old pair of sweat pants. He tends to dull down his colors, as observed in his still life demonstration. Matt has a studio and gallery in Cambridge, NY and shows in many galleries.

(No, it's hard, but achievable) and in this workshop I will introduce the "sight-size" method, a basic concept in observational realism and how to apply it to landscape or still life paintings. I will do a short demo, then we will work on composition, value, color and use of mass and line in painting. Color mixing and paint application will also be introduced. Participants should have their own materials, brushes, easel, etc...
