My interest in art started at a young age and I would often go to Thatcher Park as a teenager to paint on the Overlook Ledge with the view from the Helderbergs. I graduated from a local high school, Maria College and the University at Albany, living in the area nearly my entire life.

The pursuit of nature's beauty is always my focus. Whether the creativity of the work is reflected as representational or abstract, the world around me holds my fascination.

Although mainly self taught, I have attended workshops at the Fine Arts Work Center in Provincetown, MA, the Hudson Valley Art School in Greenville and studied several years with Betsy Apgar-Smith in Schoharie and also with Joseph McGurl in Cataumet on Cape Cod.

I was the Vice-President of Shows for the Colonie Art League for several years and am currently Vice-President of the Bethlehem Art Association. I am a member of the Albany Center Gallery, Albany Artist Group, and the East Bank Alliance in Rensselaer County. Also I attended various workshops in those groups led by nationally know artists such as Paul Leveille and Robert Carsten. In the last few years I have received numerous awards for my pastels and oil landscapes from these groups.

Much of my work is done en plein air in local and seacoast areas. A studio is maintained in my home for convenience.

In her work the pictorial subject and surface of the painting become energized realms for negotiation, composition, and harmony, where tension and impression of the image is essentially the critical purpose of the piece. Interwoven abstraction and representation, depth and surface, micro and macro, mark making and rendered objects, the works manifest my interest in the process of painting to create a hybrid state of tension, capturing an essence of time, through initiation and destruction, just as in the Anthropocene. Pushing the boundaries of painting by using, sometimes, unconventional materials and working the representation/abstraction through multiple phases of creation and destruction, (sometimes, close to obliteration), creates a tension. Into this I enter notions about dichotomies (thus, tensions) between the physical world and the transcendent realm: materialism versus non-material; representation versus abstraction; humor versus solemnity. PICK-UP – The show will end on Saturday, November 30. All entries must be retrieved by 5:00 p.m.

(NO EXCEPTIONS) If unable to do so, you must make arrangements for pick-up with another BAA member. The library cannot be held responsible.

RULES – This is an all-member, judged but not juried show. All entries will be displayed. One work will be accepted per member according to the following rules:

- 1. Each work (**one per member**) must be submitted Monday, November 4 between 3:30 p.m. and 5:30 p.m. in the Community Room of the Bethlehem Public Library. The entry fee will be \$7.00.
- 2. Paintings must be properly framed and wired for hanging with eye screws. Wire must be placed no further than 1/3 of the distance from the top of the painting. Clip frames will not be accepted. Watercolors should have mats as well as frames. Canvas may be hung unframed if the sides are painted and the staples do not show. Submissions may not be larger than 36" x 42"
- 3. All works must be original. No prints or copies will be accepted.
- 4. If a work has won an award in a previous BAA show, it may not be entered again.
- 5. Paint, especially oil, must be totally dry.
- 6. Ribbons will be awarded in all categories at the discretion of the Show Committee. The Show Committee reserves the right to reject any painting or work that does not meet the specifications or is determined to be of unsuitable subject matter.
