Dear Art Mavens,

We will soon be ending our second year of participation in the Delmar Farmer's Market. We had 15 members participate. One to two members showed their work each week. We had 2 weeks that members did not exhibit because of high winds. Most participants reported that while sales were slow, they did sell some work, especially if they kept prices low. We received much praise for our work. We recruited a number of new members through our brochures and banner. Several members reported getting art commissions from their presence at the Market. It is a great way to get your work "seen".

We will need to vote at our January meeting as to whether we rent a booth space at the Market for 2013. It costs \$300 for the outdoor space from June through October. It costs \$150 for the indoor space for October and November. This year we brought in \$370 in booth fees from our members. If we have newer members who are hoping to participate next year, this would be helpful to know (please email me).

Dee Foley has bought 4 display panels that are 6 foot tall, that come in 2 sections, at a cost of \$419.50. (They would fit in most station-wagons/ SUV's.) She proposes the group pay for them and then they would be available to BAA members for displaying their work at the Market. She has offered to "house" the panels for the group. We will vote on this also at the January meeting.

Please plan to attend our Wednesday March 27th evening meeting at the Delmar Presbyterian Church for our **ANNUAL PLANNING MEETING**. We need members to help us find professional artists in various genres who will serve as judges and/or demonstrate their artistic skills. We need feedback on what the membership wants for art demonstrations. Please consider volunteering to help run our organization. We are pleased to have one nomination for BAA President next year, Peter Keitel. In addition, Laurel Petersen has graciously agreed to serve as our Recording Secretary. Please let me know if you are interested in serving in any capacity.

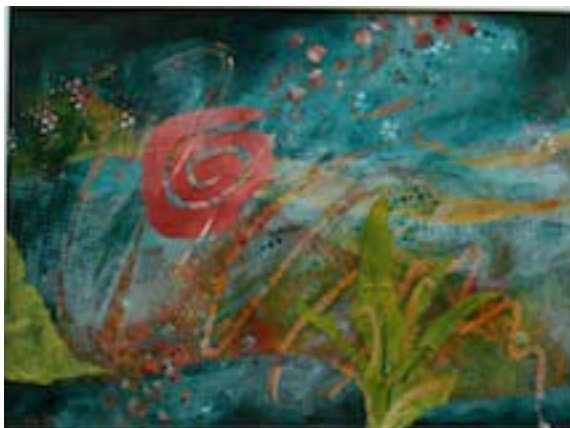

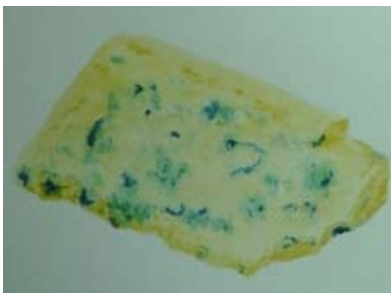
Our Fall BAA Show was a huge success
